

SAFETY AND SECURITY REGULATIONS

Safety regulations

Show management reserves the right to stop any product demonstration on the show floor which is determined by show management to be a safety hazard. Examples, but not limited to: grinding machines without proper safety shields, dangerous use of log splitters or hydraulic equipment.

- All aisles and exits must be kept clear and unobstructed.
- All motorized vehicles and gasoline powered equipment for display shall have batteries disconnected, have fuel supplies of ¼ tank or ten (10) gallons, whichever is less, furnished with locking gas caps or caps sealed with tape and a drip pan under the vehicle's drive train (motor to differential). Refueling is prohibited in the facility. Keys need to be delivered to event security. Vehicles shall not be moved during show hours. Floor plans must indicate where vehicles are to be located. See section B under Exhibit Design Regulations and the Motorized Vehicle Notification Form for more information.
- No liquid propane tanks, empty or filled, are authorized to be stored in the building. No gasoline or other type of fuel-operated motor may be demonstrated inside the exhibit during the trade show.
- Fire extinguishers, fire hoses, and sprinkler closets must be visible and accessible at all times.
- Areas enclosed by solid walls and ceilings must be provided with approved smoke detectors and/or sprinkler systems.
- Cardboard cartons or packing materials may not be stored in the booth area.

For safety and insurance reasons, children under 18 years of age are allowed in the exhibit halls during exhibition hours ONLY and must be accompanied by an adult. Adults wishing to accompany a child on the show floor must visit registration and sign any designated waivers. Please share this policy with all company employees to avoid uncomfortable situations on-site.
